### 1 Polynesian Cultural Center

### 10 Malaekahana State Beach Park

Best known for Goat Island, a twelve-acre limestone island and seabird sanctuary located just 150 yards from the beach. Visiting the Island is best done during the summer months while the tides are low (waist high) and wearing reef walking shoes (sneakers are good too). Caution needs to be observed as there are no lifeguards and the tide has been known to sweep waders out to sea with tragic results. If you are not sure do not attempt crossing.
